

Brief Notes from the Community Partnership Meeting

2pm Friday 21st July

(The interesting bits only).

Objective of Meeting

The partnership has a budget of £25k.

The objective of the meeting was to agree our priorities for the forthcoming year against which the budget could be spent. In the previous 3 years 48 projects have been funded – it was felt that this was too many – the money and efforts were being spread too thinly.

Data

A presentation extracting information in respect of the area was given (see below, can share presentation if people wish).

A lot of the conclusions were skewed towards Martlesham and Kesgrave, but of interest to us:

- A significant proportion of children leaving primary school are obese.
- Only about 50% of adults are doing an exercise.
- There are significantly more road accidents in the summer months.
- There is an 'epidemic' of Mental Health issues with young people. This was based on feedback from Farlingaye High School – but not discussed in detail as they are waiting from feedback from Kesgrave.

Input

We formed up in to small teams to discuss prioritise. I was with Alan (Kesgrave), Luke (ESC), James (Rushmere) and, most importantly Jan from Charsfield.

My input:

- Public transport links to Woodbridge – principally linking with the train service, school and surgery both during the day and in the evenings.
This was sort of put on hold pending the results of the 3 bus trials in Lowestoft, Wickham Market (Klatch) and Leiston (yet to start apparently).

- Bike Route Map / Quiet Lane and Footpath Map
East Suffolk should publish bike routes between the villages / safe places to cross the A12 etc (to support active travel).
(see Sofl 5.5)

Actions

Based upon discussions / feedback / things others had done, and independent of anything the Community Partnership actually does (although we could ask for funding).

- Find out how many teenagers there are in the village and what (if anything) we could do for them. Suggestion was a paper-based survey (which I'm happy to do)
(Sofl 3)
- Link up with Charsfield, Debach, Dallinghoo to create an environmental partnership with a view to linking wildlife areas together / carrying out wildlife surveys etc.
(Sofl 2)
- Consider public transport needs for Bredfield / community bus etc, and share thoughts with our neighbouring villages.

Survey Analysis

Areas which are purely information (for example employment sector, house prices) have been excluded as have topics which exclude Bredfield (for example school performance).
